Queen Vashti's Comfy Pants does a wonderful job of filling in some of the blanks in our understanding of Vashti's role in the Purim story. In a family education setting, after reading *Megilat Esther* and this book, ask participants what else might be missing. Encourage them to tell those stories through music, dance, poetry, painting, or anything else that feels meaningful.

Rhymin' Simon

Part of the delight of this book is its clever rhyme scheme and rhythm. Ask the children in a class to identify what the pattern is in *Queen Vashti's Comfy Pants*. Once they do, see if they can tell another story using this same device. Provide a rhyming dictionary or point them to one online.
